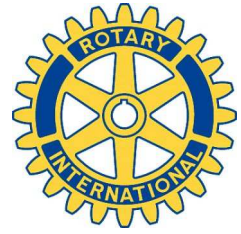

Downtown San Diego Breakfast Rotary Steps to Becoming a New Member

The following steps are a basic outline of the process of becoming a member of the Downtown San Diego Breakfast Rotary. A detailed accounting can be obtained online at our website, www.sdrotary.org. If you have additional questions, please feel free to call a membership representative or your sponsor.

1. Attendance: After you have attended at least 3 meetings and have been introduced to the board, your sponsor can propose you as a new member

1. Sponsorship: Your sponsor will then submit a Membership Proposal form with your name to our board along with their recommendation
2. Board Approval: The Board of Directors will make a determination upon your classification and sponsor recommendation to approve your membership
3. Published Intent: Upon Board Approval, the Membership Chair or your sponsor will confirm you are approved and then your name and proposed classification will be published in our bulletin

If no general member has an objection you are ready for induction

4. Induction: After your name is published and there are no objections, your badge is ordered and your name is submitted to Rotary International

All dues and fees will be billed to you at that time

On an agreed date, you will be inducted as our newest member before a general meeting

The whole process will take at least two months. In the meantime, please continue to attend as a guest. You will simply pay for breakfast each week, which is \$18. You are encouraged to attend the social events and get to know the other members.

We look forward to having you as a member!

San Diego Downtown Breakfast Rotary Information for New Members

1. Dues and other costs:

Club Membership Fee	\$100
Dues:	\$35 per Quarter
Breakfast:	\$14 per Week
Community Service Pledge:	\$25 per Quarter
Annual Fundraising Project:	\$250 (approximate)

Invoices are sent Quarterly

2. Attendance Requirements

Members are encouraged to attend all meetings, or make-up at another Rotary Club within two weeks

3. Blue Badge Requirements: New members receive a “Red Badge” and earn their “Blue Badge” by completing the following requirements. The purpose of these requirements is to help new members learn about our club and provide an opportunity to meet other members.

- Attend District Event or District Council
- Make up at another Rotary Club
- Give an Invocation or Chair of the Day
- Join a Committee
- Write a Bulletin
- Attend a Rotary Board Meeting
- Bring a Guest
- Be a “Greeter of the Day”
- Attend a Rotaract Meeting

4. Participation

Rotary is a service organization. This requires active participation of our members in the various events and activities our club sponsors.
